

Dr Terry Gill is Professor of Military Law at the University of Amsterdam and the Netherlands Defence Academy. Professor Gill is Director of the Research Programme “Role of Law in Armed Conflict & Peace Operations” at the Amsterdam Center for International Law (ACIL). He is editor in chief of the *Yearbook of International Humanitarian Law*, member of the editorial boards of the *Journal of Armed Conflict & Security Law*, *Journal of International Peacekeeping* and *Military Law Review*. He was a member of the expert group convened by the ICRC and TMC Asser Institute on “Direct Participation in Hostilities”, of the International Group of Experts which drew up the *Tallinn Manual on the International Law Applicable to Cyber Warfare* and of the *Tallinn 2.0 Project* on the application of international law to peacetime cyber security and is a board member of the International Society of Military Law and the Law of War ( Brussels) and senior academic advisor to the Society’s project on the drafting of “*The International Law of Peace Operations*”. He is Chairman of the Study Group on *The Conduct of Hostilities in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century* of the International Law Association ( London), He is author of numerous publications on the use of force, international humanitarian law and the law of military operations including the authoritative *Handbook of the International Law of Military Operations* published by Oxford University Press ( 1<sup>st</sup> ed 2010, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2015). He teaches courses in international law relating to military operations, international humanitarian law and related topics at the University of Amsterdam and Netherlands Defence Academy and is a frequent guest lecturer at universities and other institutions inside and outside the Netherlands
