


Cyberspace (Digital Domain) New target surface

 - Violation of sovereignty








Sovereignty

On Sovereignty



- Physical damage
- Functional damage
- Below functional damage

THREAT OF FORCE

- Violation of political independence
 - Domain inherently governmental functions
 - Nature (no damage required)
 - Interference
 - Usurpation



Violate International Law

- Disinformation
 - Does <u>not</u> breach Territorial Integrity
 - Can breach Political Independence
 - Not taking over State Functions
 - But interfering with them
 - Can breach Prohibition of Intervention
 - Tampering with domestic jurisdiction
 - In a coercive manner (via manipulation)
 - → Disinformation can violate International Law





